His Business Advisor, Gordan, worked with Tamer to put a business plan and financial forecast together which helped bring Tamer's thoughts and ideas into a more structured format and helped focus his mind on exactly what steps he needed to take to get his business up and running.

Tamer chose a company name, decided on his legal status, opened a bank account and got the correct insurances that he required.

Gordon was then able to help Tamer apply for a £250 Glasgow City Council new business start-up grant which allowed Tamer to purchase some extra tools, they then focused heavily on marketing and pricing which is the most important area to work on for any new business. Tamer really took this on board – who his customer could be, how could he find them and how they could find him.

Tamer started trading just 2 months after joining the PeoplePlus programme and is delighted with how he has progressed. Tamer now has work booked in until the end of the year.
