


Self-Employment Programme Proposal

We will engage with prisoners:

Who are nearing resettlement with an interest in self-employment



Who already have a trade that would be suited to self-employment (construction, barbers)



This course will run for 4 sessions over 4 days with cell work provided.

Group sessions on core topics, including:

Is SE Right for Me? Informing participants of the various types of SE; identifying participants' traits, skills, and abilities to run a business and exploring their business ideas; considering whether being self-employed would suit their lifestyle, interests and personal situation.

Business Formats & Subcontracting:

Understanding the Pros and Cons of business structures, Self-employment, Franchise and Subcontracting: Registration and Tax implications for Self-Assessment with a detailed understanding of the Construction Industry Scheme, outlining the key business issues needed as a subcontractor

Market Research and Business Planning:

researching markets, customers, and competitors, applicable legislation, and the key elements that contribute to business viability.





Business Planning: Participants will understand the content and start to complete a business plan template throughout the course with signposting to external support.

Marketing/Social Media: the importance of brand and selecting the appropriate marketing mix and social media platforms for their individual marketing requirements, providing an understanding of social media marketing strategies.

Finance, cost analysis and Pricing for business: understanding basic accounting, costing and pricing of products and services. Reporting and legal requirements of HMRC.

On completion of the course, we will endeavour to maintain contact with any prisoners that leave the care of SPS within 8wks of the course... if they are still interested in pursuing SE we will offer 3 follow-up telephone/ Teams support sessions to progress their business.
